# **REPORT OF LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE OF LEFSC OF 2006**

President Roger Powell, charged this committee, to recommend a series of goals so the Board of Directors could consider at its September meeting which can be used by the Board of Directors to govern its efforts for the near future. Below are 8 proposed goals. One or more of which the committee believes are deserving of the efforts of the Eye Foundation which are compatible with its mission and one operational goal. For sake of reference, in discussion of the proposals, each suggested goal is numbered. These numbers do not denote any priority in importance. Many of these proposals will require much more planning to implement.

# Proposal 1

Enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Southern California College of Optometry to enable it to use the Mobile Health Screening Unit. In exchange the LEFSC may require the college to present programs to the Eye Foundation and provide assistance in the operation of the Eye Mobile. This proposal could include a grant of funds by LEFSC to the college in addition to provisions for scholarships in proposal 6.

# Proposal 2

Expand the glasses program. LEFSC should maintain an inventory of different size glasses adequate to meet its own needs and furnish any excess glasses to Lions insight. This would require LEFSC to clean, calibrate, box, store and distribute glasses.

# **Proposal 3**

Notwithstanding the failure of LEFSC and the Southern California Lions Eye Institute ("SCLEI") to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with one another, LEFSC should refer any financially qualified persons needing vision surgery to SCLEI and support SCLEI in its effort to provide a meaningful surgical program. It is to be hoped that in some point in the future a more meaningful relationship can be developed between the two foundations. Meanwhile LEFSC should institute a series of contacts with eye clinics throughout Southern California with the view of establishing a medical/surgical program. If, as is hoped, more cooperation can be achieved between LEFSC and SCLEI, any clinic or progress which is made by LEFSC in its surgical program can be affiliated with that of SCLEI in order to provide a more comprehensive series of clinics throughout Southern California. Similarly, the Eye Mobile should be continued to be made available to Lions Clubs throughout Southern California.

# **Proposal 4**

Continue to promote a closer relationship to the Doheny Eye and Tissue Bank. This can be achieved by LEFSC's donating a larger amount of funds to Doheny to cover the cost of cornea transplants supplied by Doheny for which does not receive compensation via insurance or government benefits. Doheny in turn would be requested to provide a representative from Doheny to LEFSC who could appear semi-annually to provide information as to the number of or cornea transplants and the cost thereof which for which Doheny does not receive reimbursement and the promise of Doheny to make its facilities available at least once a year upon request of LEFSC for a meeting or meetings of LEFSC and for tours to participate at such meetings.

# **Proposal 5**

As some persons who participate in eye screenings in the Eye Mobile may not have insurance or adequate funds to cover an examination by an optometrist or ophthalmologist, LEFSC should develop a card with the telephone number and address of the clinic which operates the love program and educates members of Lions Clubs and other organizations using the Eye Mobile how to distribute the card to any persons who indicate their financial ability to afford examinations and lack of vision insurance. Such card should only be available to persons who express financial difficulties. Consideration should also be given to the sponsoring clubs assistance to the individual, if necessary, in getting to the clinic in Los Angeles. To implement this goal, LEFSC should consider a financial contribution to the love program.

# **Proposal 6**

Provide up to 5 scholarships annually of a value between \$500 and \$1000 to deserving students identified by the Southern California College of Optometry to assist in the education of those students. It is believed active participation by Lionism in the training of optometrists would encourage those students during their training and in their practice to support Lionism.

# Proposal 7

Develop more information and understanding for the field of low vision aids, including the availability of aids, the cost of such aids and the financial resources available to persons needing such aids.

# **Proposal 8**

As an operational goal, LEFSC should continue its plan for a speaker's bureau by developing a kit of materials which speakers can use and by periodically conducting training sessions at which each prospective speaker can develop his knowledge and background information behind each project concerning which he speaks and develop new skills in making an effective presentation regarding the Eye Foundation, the Mobile Health Screening Unit and the Memorial Trust.
